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## Use our data to better understand children's well-being

We are very pleased to offer you the opportunity to use our data from the first wave of data collection.

The international dataset from the first wave of data collection is now freely available to researches for exploring the subjective well-being of children.

This is the largest international dataset of children's subjective well-being. It includes the perceptions and evaluations of about 34,500 children age 8-12 from 14 countries: Algeria, Brazil, Canada, Chile, England, Israel, Nepal, Romania, Rwanda, South Africa, South Korea, Spain, Uganda, and United States.

The dataset comprises a wide range of questions in various areas of life, including family, friends and relationships, time use, the area in which they live, school, their future and several psychometric measures of subjective well-being.

We want to encourage you to make use of the data for investigating the condition and well-being of children, contributing new insights to the body of knowledge and improving the lives of children.
