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The International Survey of Children's Well-being Introduction

- Children's Worlds is a world-wide research survey on children's subjective well-being.
- The main aim of the study is to collect solid and representative data on children's lives and daily activities, their time use and in particular on their own perceptions and evaluations of their well-being.
- The purpose is **to improve children's well-being** by creating awareness among children, their parents and their communities, but also among opinion leaders, decision makers, professionals and the general public.
- By studying children's worlds in as many countries as possible, we hope to raise awareness of children's well-being and their life situations and to influence government policies and services.





The International Survey of Children's Well-being Introduction

- The project recognizes that **children's rights** are fundamental to children having a good childhood and good future life chances.
- Children require an atmosphere, in which they feel 'good' with their lives, can follow their own predispositions and are prompted to bring out the best of themselves.
- One of the most important factors in assessing whether a particular environment is conducive to children attaining their best potential is the perception of their own subjective sense of well-being. This is best done by asking children directly and by allowing them to give an assessment of their own well-being.





The International Survey of Children's Well-being History

- 2009 the beginning of the project,
- 2010 the first draw version of the survey was piloted,

 (Brasil, England, Germany, Honduras, Israel, Palestine, Spain)
- 2011 a second draw version of the survey was piloted,

 (Germany, Palestine, Romania, South Africa, Spain, Turey)
- 2012 WAVE 1 large-scale pilot of the survey of **over 30 000** children (aged 8 to 13), (Algieria, Brasil, Canada, Chile, England, Ethiopia, Israel, Nepal, Romania, South Africa, South Korea, Spain, Uganda, USA)
- 2013 WAVE 2 the survey of **over 45 000** children (aged 8 to 12) from 15 countries, (Algieria, Colombia, England, Estonia, Ethiopia, Germany, Israel, Nepal, Norway, **Poland**, Romania, South Africa, South Korea, Spain, Turkey)





The International Survey of Children's Well-being

The Questionnaires

- You (age, gender, place of living, country born)
- Your home and the people you live with (sleeping place, the home you live in, the people you live with, parents' working abroad, agreement, satisfaction, activities)
- Money and things you have (pocket money, things you have, worry, satisfaction, adults with paid job)
- Your friends and other people (agreement, satisfaction, activities)
- The area where you live (agreement, satisfaction)
- School (agreement, bullying, satisfaction)
- Using your free time (Bob's list)
- More about you and your life (satisfaction, happiness, changes, Huebner SLSS, values aspired to, children's rights)

The scales were modified to produce a total life satisfaction score in the range from 0 to 100.





The ISCWeB survey in Poland

The sample

- The survey was conducted in **Wielkopolska** region from March to June 2014 among school children **aged from 8 to 12**.
- The representative sample of 65 schools was selected using a multistage stratified random sampling method,
- The schools were stratified by three factors:
 - school type (public and non public schools).
 - territorial unit (six NTS3 subregions),
 - area type (urban and rural area).
- Within each selected school, **one class for each children's age group** (from 2nd, 4th and 6th grade) was randomly selected.

The ISCWeB survey in Poland The sample

- N=**3157** children aged from 8 to 13
- 48.1% girls, 51.9% boys
- 57.7% from urban schools, 42.3% from rural schools
- 96.7% from public schools, 3.3% from non-public schools
- 99.5% were born in Poland
- over 99% were living in a household with their own family
- 84.5% were living with both parents



















% of 12-year-olds with low satisfaction with BMSLSS items according to sex and school area type











% of children with low satisfaction with family life according to sex and school area type











% of children with low satisfaction with friends according to sex and school area type











% of children with low satisfaction with school experience according to sex and school area type











% of children with low satisfaction with own body according to sex and school area type











% of children with low satisfaction with the area where they live according to sex and school area type

CONCLUSIONS

- The study on subjective well-being of the children aged 8-12 years from Wielkopolskie voivodship shows that the children's satisfaction with their lives was fairly high.
- The level of overall life satisfaction was decreasing along with age of the children.
- The share of children whose assessment of their life was low reached the level of 0.8% (BMSLSS for 8-year-olds) to even 10.7% (OLS for 12-year-olds).
- There was a mixed pattern of gender differences in overall SWB.
- Children from rural area schools had slightly higher levels of subjective well-being whichever measure was used.





CONCLUSIONS

- The findings on children's feelings about five different aspects of their lives show some important variations.
- The level of satisfaction with various BMSLSS items was decreasing along with age of the children.
- The aspect of life with which the children were most satisfied (regardless of age and sex) was family life.
- The **worst marks** were given by the children (regardless of age) to the aspect connected with their **school life**.
- There was a relatively **low level of satisfaction** among the 12-year-olds (especially among girls) with their **own bodies**.
