1. Satisfaction/Happiness

How satisfied are you with your life as a whole
(0 to 10 scale, 'Not at all' to 'Totally')

2. Agreement

I feel safe at home
(5-point scale, 'Not at all agree' to 'Totally agree')

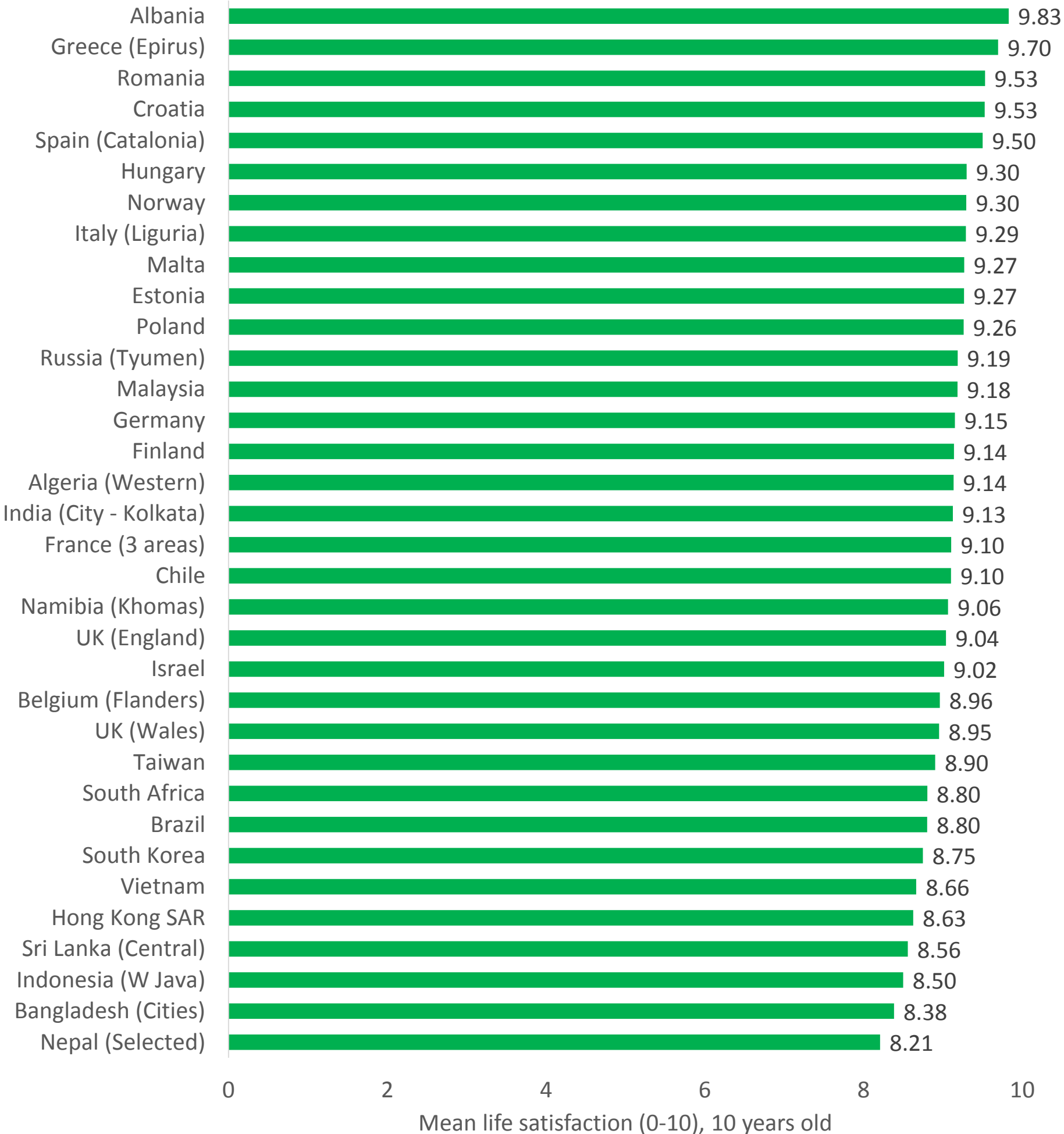
3. Frequency

How often do you help around the house?
(6-point scale, 'Never' to 'Every day')

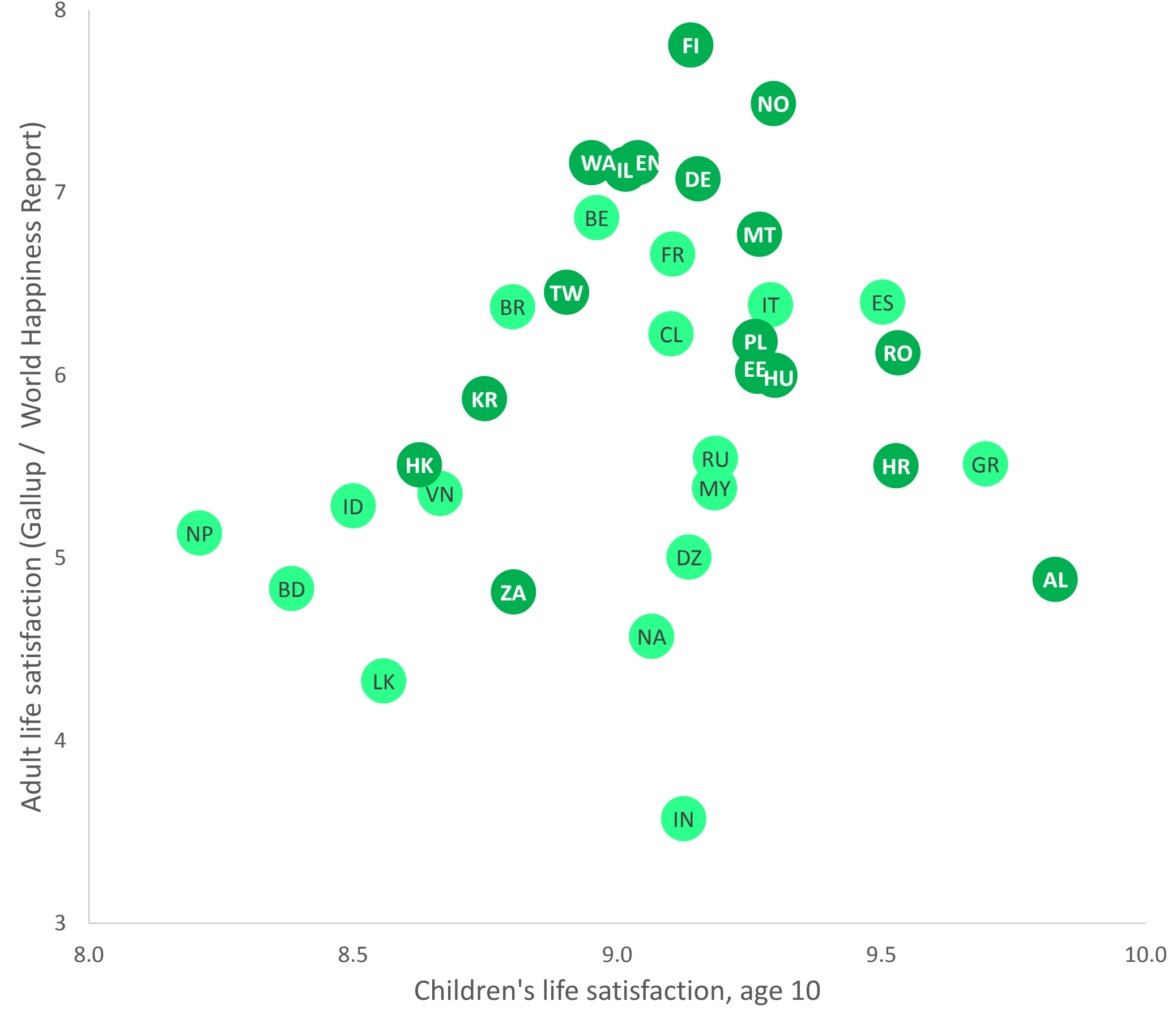
4. Fact-based

Do you have the equipment you need for school?
('No' / ' Yes')

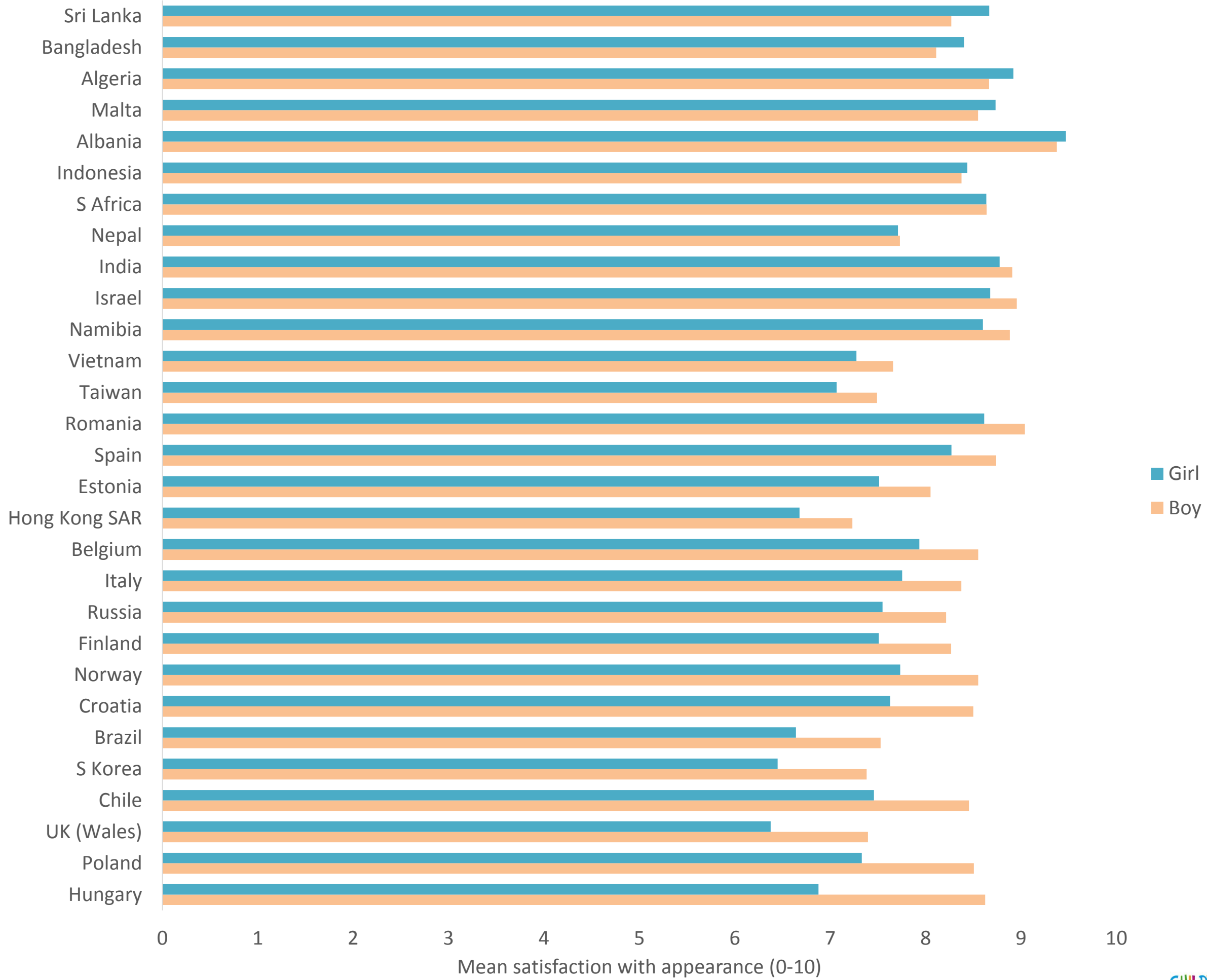


Satisfaction with life as a whole:
Comparing adults and children



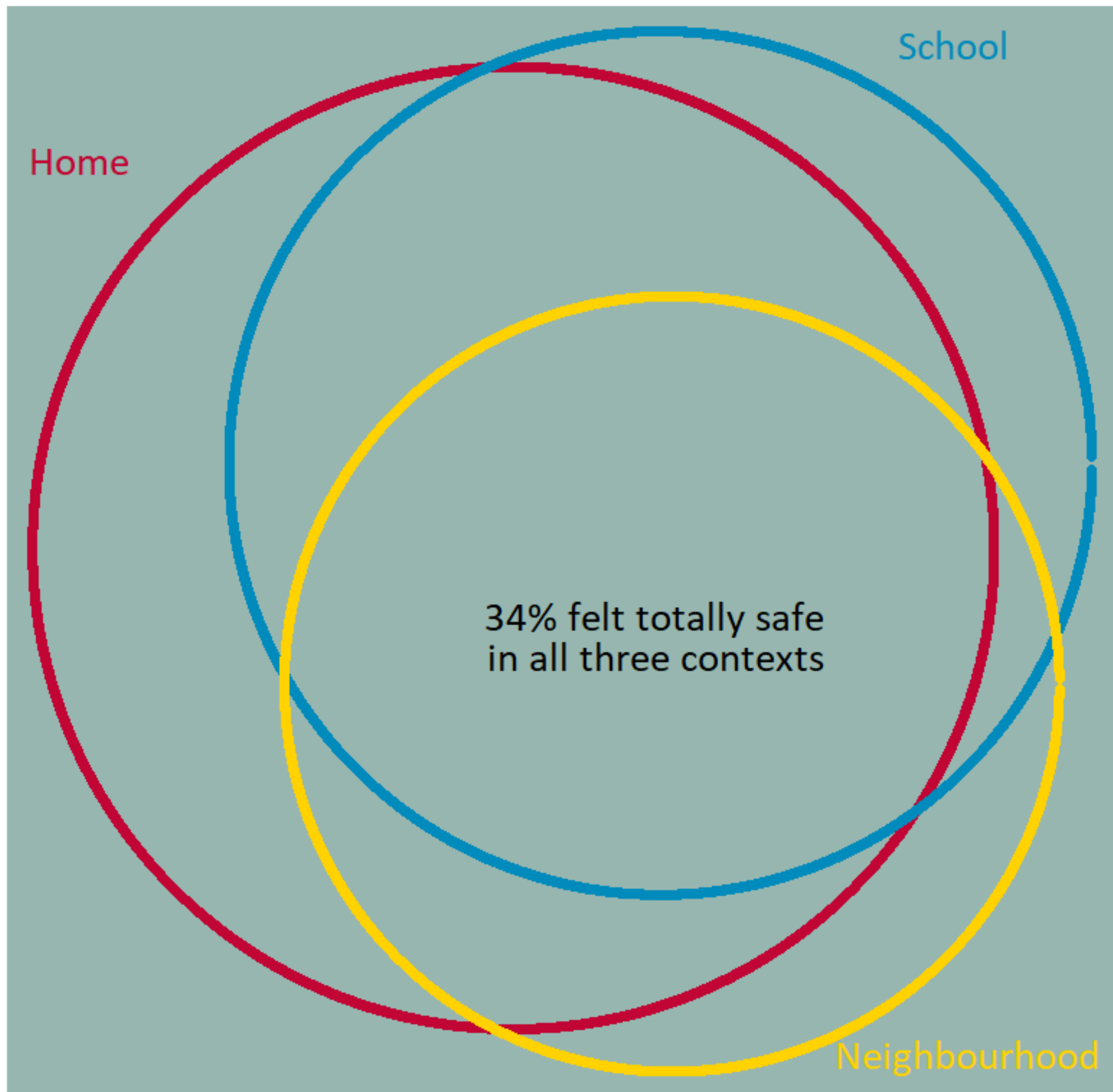

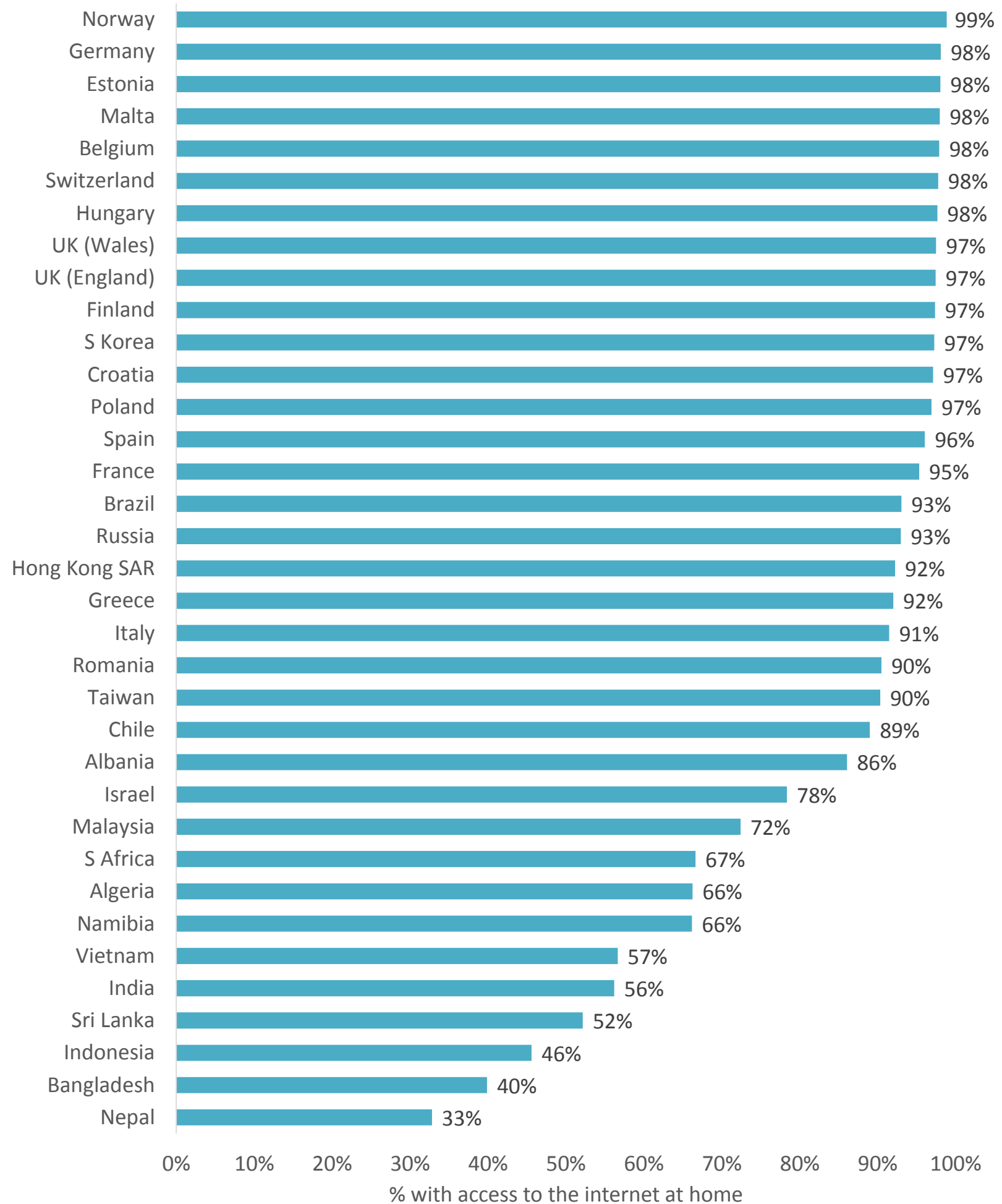

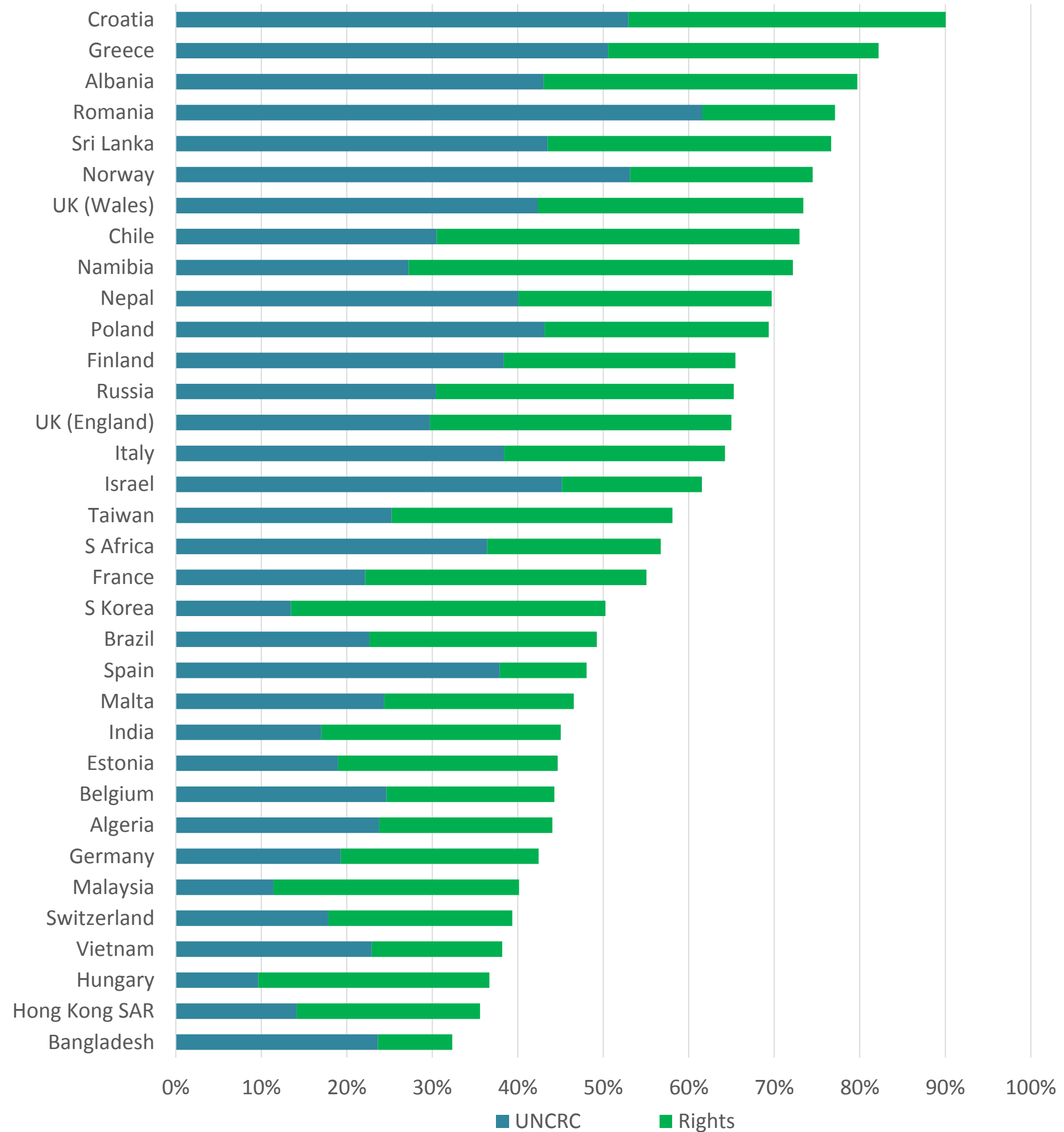
