2. Agreement

I feel safe at home (5-point scale, 'Not at all agree' to 'Totally agree')

3. Frequency

4. Fact-based

How often do you help around the house? (6-point scale, 'Never' to 'Every day')




Mean life satisfaction (0-10), 10 years old

Age differences




